

## New on the Shelves

"New on the Shelves" is a list of recent additions to the collections of the State Historical Society of Iowa. It includes manuscripts, audio-visual materials, and published materials recently acquired or newly processed that we think might be of particular interest to the readers of the *Annals of Iowa*. The "DM" or "IC" at the end of each entry denotes whether the item is held in Des Moines or Iowa City.

Soroptomist International—North Central U.S. Region [Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota]. Records, 1960s–1990s. Addition to collection. 2 ft. Minutes, reports, correspondence, conference materials, newsletters and compiled history materials for regional chapter of this volunteer service organization for business and professional women.
