# Iowa History and Culture: A Bibliography of Materials Published from 1987 through 1991

THIS BIBLIOGRAPHY is a listing of works on Iowa published during the years 1987–1991. It supplements the book, Iowa History and Culture: A Bibliography of Materials Published Between 1952 and 1986, compiled by David Hudson and I and published in 1989 by the State Historical Society of Iowa in association with Iowa State University Press. Subject arrangement of this listing follows closely the organization of the 1989 book. Brief annotations are included when the subject classification or title do not sufficiently reveal the nature of the material. Included in this list are a few items published earlier than 1987 that escaped us in the compilation of the 1989 book. This is the first of three installments; the remaining listings will appear in the summer and fall issues.
