New on the Shelves

"New on the Shelves" is a list of recent additions to the collections of the State Historical Society of Iowa. It includes manuscripts, audio-visual materials, and published materials recently acquired or newly processed that we think might be of particular interest to the readers of the *Annals of Iowa*. The "DM" or "IC" at the end of each entry denotes whether the item is held in Des Moines or Iowa City.

Smith, Charles Lavaughn. Papers. 3¹⁄₂ ft., 1938–1947. Papers of Smith, graduate of Yale University Divinity School, U.S. Navy chaplain (26 years), ancient languages and Old Testament scholar, professor of religion and Near Eastern studies at Drake University (45 years), and chaplain for the Des Moines Police Department. DM.

World War II. Correspondence. ¼ ft., 1942–1944. World War II correspondence between Private Daniel Stevens (Waterloo) and his wife, Patricia. Stevens was stationed in New Guinea with the Second U.S. Transportation Corps. DM.

Retterath, Michael Joseph. 53 glass plate negatives, 1910–1915. Includes views of Stacyville (barn building, businesses, flood, etc.). DM.
