New on the Shelves

"New on the Shelves" is a list of recent additions to the collections of the State Historical Society of Iowa. It includes manuscripts, audio-visual materials, and published materials recently acquired or newly processed that we think might be of particular interest to the readers of the *Annals of Iowa*. The "DM" or "IC" at the end of each entry denotes whether the item is held in Des Moines or Iowa City.

Manuscripts and Records

Aldrich, Charles and Thirza (Briggs). Papers, ca. 1854–1906. ½ ft. Correspondence, miscellaneous documentation, and photographs of this couple, primarily consisting of letters generated through Charles Aldrich's work as an Iowa newspaperman, state legislator, and first curator of the Iowa State Historical Department. This collection, from a descendant of Thirza Briggs, supplements a substantial collection of Aldrich papers already held by the State Historical Society. DM.

Eckroate, John. Papers, 1862–1865. ¾ ft. More than 150 Civil War letters of Private John Eckroate of Mahaska County, who served with Company C of the 33rd Iowa Volunteer Infantry. Letters are accompanied by 1862 diary entries and miscellaneous military documents and ephemera. DM.

Iowa Suffrage Memorial Commission. Architectural drawings, ca. 1925. Two drawings of a proposed suffrage memorial for the state capitol grounds submitted to, but unused by, the commission, which eventually installed a bas relief inside the statehouse to commemorate the work of suffragists. DM.

Refugees, Political (1970s). Papers, 1983. 1 vol. Compilation of papers written by Cambodian, Laotian, and Vietnamese students for their "English as Second Language" class at Hoover High School (Des Moines). The students describe life in their homelands before and after the Communist takeover, the transition through Thai refugee camps, and relocation to the United States. DM.

Rus, Claus. Correspondence, 1898. Two detailed letters written by Corporal Claus Rus of Council Bluffs while serving with Company L of the 51st Iowa Volunteer Infantry during the Spanish-American War. Letters include descriptions of travel on the transport ship *Pennsylvania* and observations about Spanish soldiers and prisoners in Manila. DM.

Walton, Mary Elizabeth (Barrows). Papers, 1856–1858. 1 vol. Journal kept by this pioneer schoolteacher while she held positions at Muscatine, Iowa, and Lyndon, Illinois; returned to her family home in Clayville, New York, for a brief period; and permanently resettled in Muscatine as the wife of prominent citizen Josiah P. Walton. DM.

Churches and religion. Black-and-white panoramic photograph, 1922. Group photo showing attendees of the 134th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of the United States, Des Moines, Iowa, May 18–25, 1922. DM.

Churches and religion. Two 35mm color slides, October 4, 1979. Close-up candids of Pope John Paul II taken during his visit to Living History Farms. DM.

Iowa State University. One black-and-white photograph, 1932. Group photo of the university's Cossacks, a stunt horse riding organization open to members of the campus ROTC and students of the college of veterinary medicine. DM.

Peterson, Richard W. Digital video disk (94 mins.), September 21, 2004. Oral history interview of this retired U.S. Judge Magistrate in which he discusses his life and career as a lawyer and federal judicial officer at Council Bluffs; his service with the 342nd Infantry in World War II; and his historical research and publications. DM.

Reynoldson, W. Ward. Digital video disk (90 mins.), November 16, 2004. Oral history interview of this lawyer and former Iowa Supreme Court Justice in which he discusses his private practice in Osceola; memorable cases he heard while on the Iowa bench; and changes witnessed in the state court systems. War Camp Community Service (Des Moines). Four black-and-white photographs, ca. 1918. Views of girls' recreational activities sponsored by this community program, including group photos of the African American drill team and Dutch folk dancing troupe. DM.
