

## New on the Shelves

"New on the Shelves" is a list of recent additions to the collections of the State Historical Society of Iowa. It includes manuscripts, audio-visual materials, and published materials recently acquired or newly processed that we think might be of particular interest to the readers of the *Annals of Iowa*. The "DM" or "IC" at the end of each entry denotes whether the item is held in Des Moines or Iowa City.

ACCESS [A Concerned Community for Education, Safer-Sex, and Support] in Northeast Iowa. Newsletters, 1987–2004+. 3½ ft. Run of *Accessline* newsletter, a monthly publication initially launched to raise awareness about AIDS among northeast Iowa's gay population and later expanding to become a statewide news source for the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender community, with information on a variety of social and political issues affecting that audience. Beving, Heikens, and associated families. Papers and records, ca. 1880–ca. 2000. ¾ ft. Documentation and photographs related to these families of East Frisian heritage who settled in Grundy and Clay County, Iowa. DM.

Craig and Rosenberger families. Papers and records, 1878–1909. ¾ ft. Account books of Ella Craig (Mitchellville), 1878–1909; record book of the Congregational Young Persons Society of Christian Endeavors (Mitchellville), 1896–1901; and diary of George Rosenberger (Iowa County), 1890–1892. DM.

Polk County, Iowa. Records, 1896–1901. ½ ft. Documentation related to land condemnation cases involving the Inter-Urban Railway Company and other property acquisitions for rail and street improvements. DM.

Templeton, Wesley. Papers, 1863–1865. ¼ ft. 35 Civil War letters written by this member of the Eighth Iowa Volunteer Cavalry, Company D, and postwar narrative accounts of his military experiences, which included a period of imprisonment at Andersonville Prison. DM.
