

## New on the Shelves

"New on the Shelves" is a list of recent additions to the collections of the State Historical Society of Iowa. It includes manuscripts, audio-visual materials, and published materials recently acquired or newly processed that we think might be of particular interest to the readers of the *Annals of Iowa*. The "DM" or "IC" at the end of each entry denotes whether the item is held in Des Moines or Iowa City.

Historians' books containing minutes, reports, newsletters, miscellaneous communications, ephemera, and photographs of this organization whose membership comprised women who lost children during, or as a result of, U.S. military service. Blooming Prairie Warehouse, Inc. Records, 1972–2002. 16 ft. Plans, programs, activities, and literature of Iowa-based organic foods cooperative. IC.

Boulton, Jack. Correspondence, 1941–1952. ½ ft. Boulton family correspondence, including letters from Jack Boulton to his family during his service in the Navy during World War II and the Korean Conflict. IC.

Claxtonola and National Records: A Provisional Catalog. Book, 2003. A short history and compendium of information about the Bernard Manufacturing Co. of Iowa City, producer of Victrolas, and its labels for 78rpm records. IC.

ERA proclamation. Broadside. 1972. Proclamation presented to the Senate chamber of the Iowa legislature signed by women supporting passage of the Equal Rights Amendment. IC.

Greater Des Moines Garden Club, Inc. 1 scrapbook, 1930–1952. News clippings, ephemera, and miscellaneous organizational papers documenting the activities of this club. DM.

La Sertoma Club of Des Moines. Records, 1930–1989. 1½ ft. Records of this women's auxiliary of the Sertoma Club, a civic service organization. Collection includes minutes, constitution and by-laws, yearbooks, and scrapbooks. DM.

Link, W. Harland. Manuscripts, 1912–1920. Diaries of Waukon area farmer. IC.

Mary O. Coldren Home. Records, 1910–1921. 1 ft. Meeting minutes, resident lists, and daily activities at Iowa City retirement home. Includes a history of the home by Harriet Stevens. IC.

Perry, Verla Wilson. 2 scrapbooks, 1914–1926, documenting the musical pursuits and interests of this Perry woman, including her experience as a vocalist and cellist with the Jones and Cadman Chautauqua troupes in 1917. Also contains ephemera from Perry and Des Moines theaters and concert events. DM.

Phi Beta Pi Medical Fraternity. Records, 1890s–1990s. ½ ft. Two volumes with meeting minutes and membership information for the University of Iowa chapter of the Phi Beta Pi Medical Fraternity. IC.

Whitcomb, Joel. Account book, 1855–1878. Daybook of Mitchell County farmer, including purchases, accounts, and commodity prices. IC.

Younkers (Younker Brothers, Inc.). Records, ca. 1880–2002. 40 ft. Records of this department store corporation, which originated in Keokuk in 1856 and relocated its central operation to Des Moines in 1874. Collection includes interoffice memos, annual reports, executive bulletins, employee newsletters and publications, deeds, contracts, promotional and training materials, photographs, blueprints, histories, scrapbooks, and accounting, incorporation, and stock records. Also contains some records of the Harris-Emery department store, which merged with Younkers in 1927. DM.
