

Dragoons' Map of Iowa Territory in 1844

Portion of "Map of the Route passed over by Company I Ist Dragoons in the Indian country, in the Northwestern part of Iowa Territory during the Summer and Fall of 1844." The map includes the boundaries between tribes, trails, camps, forts, rapids, and Indian villages, including the four villages east of the confluence of the Raccoon and Des Moines rivers, where the Sauk and Meskwaki (Sac and Fox) lived during part of their forced relocation out of Iowa Territory. The map was drawn by Joseph Haydn Potter in 1844.
