SHERLEY A. WILLIAMS' book, *The Peacock Poems*, was nominated for the National Book Award. She teaches at The University of California at San Diego.

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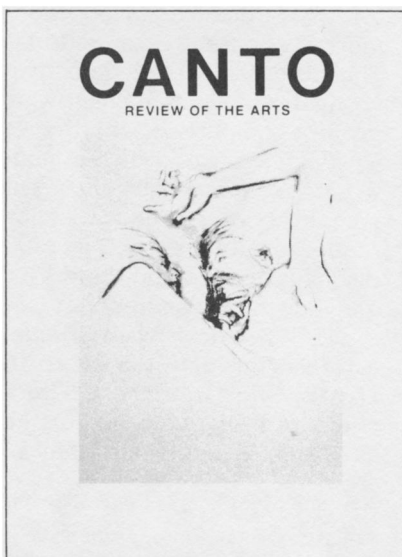
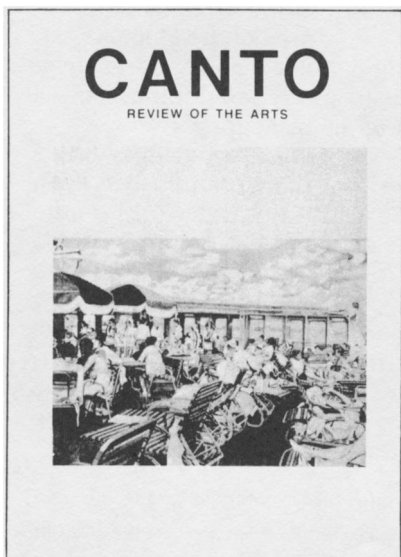
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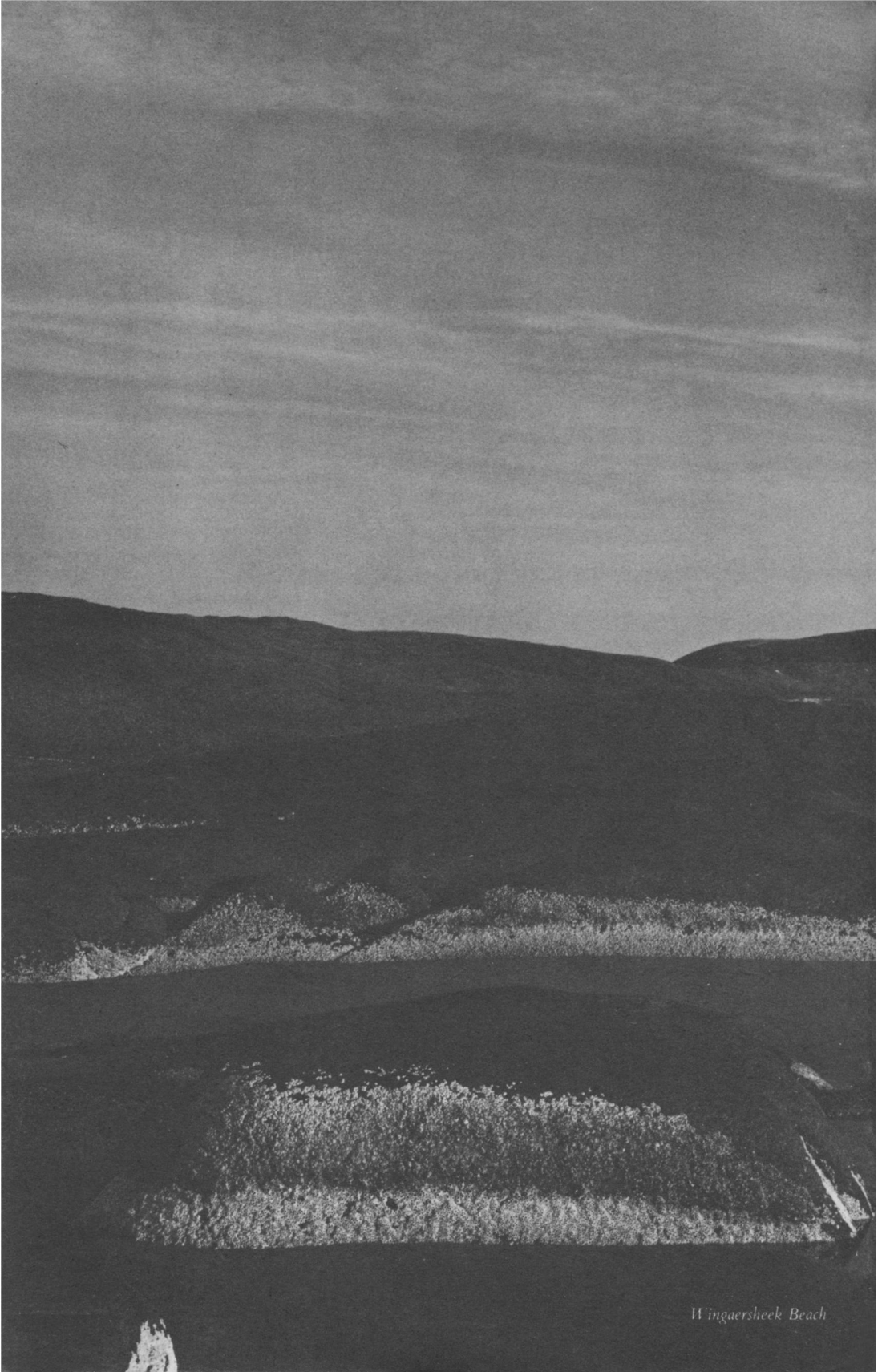
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
