This sheet accompanied the Journal of two sessions in a Council held in this city with an delegation of Chiefs and Braves of the Confederated Tribes of Sac and Fox Indians of the Mississippi, as a delegation of Sac and Fox and Iowa Chiefs and Braves of the Missouri. October 7 - 1837 and 10<sup>th</sup> hills.

It was read by an Indian and given to C. A. Harris, Sag. Crow on the part of the U. S. "Sta. - chief - on" an Ioway Chief who forward and returned to the drawing his address at the Council as appears upon page 196 and 197 of the Journal of the Council.
