PATRICIA FOSTER received her MFA from the Iowa Writers' Workshop in 1986 and her PhD from Florida State University in 1993. She is editing two anthologies, *Minding the Body* and *The Sister Plot*, for Anchor/Doubleday. Her work has appeared in *The Gettysburg Review*, *The Ohio Review*, and *River Styx*, among others.

JOHN GERY's second collection of poems, *The Enemies of Leisure*, is forthcoming from Story Line Press in 1994. A recipient of a 1992 Creative Writing Fellowship from the NEA, he is an Associate Professor at the University of New Orleans. His short stories have appeared in The North American Review, The Malahat Review, Confrontation, Gargoyle, and Satori. His first novel, Straitjacket and Tie, will be published by Ticknor & Fields in February, 1994.




Painting, "Monument with Kerbstones," 1991 by Camille Ward. Oil on paper 14" x 16"




