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Our front cover image reproduces 20th century Turkish *cuvals*, or storage bags from the central Anatolian region of Karapinar. Almost always woven in pairs, these bags were used primarily for gathering brush. Tightly woven, they feature a simple pattern of alternating natural cream and brown wool. Of great interest is the use of felt between the bag face and the card-woven goat hair belt. Felt production, common in the region between Afyon, Konya, and Karapinar, has all but disappeared in Anatolia. These bags are from the collection of Keith Achepohl.
