

Everyone is curious about the new benches on the Ped Mall. Are they an example of hostile architecture, designed to make life harder on the homeless? Or are they designed that way to be ADA-compliant? Or is there another line of thought behind this particular choice in benches? -Nik, Iowa City, via email

he answers, in brief (and in order), are not intentionally, not exactly and yes. For fuller answers, it's best to take the questions in reverse order. As part of the ongoing Ped Mall

Improvement Project, the 85 benches that were in place when the project began, which only had armrests at each end, are being replaced by 70 new ones, all of which have armrests in the middle as well. The 47 shorter benches have a single armrest in the center, and 23 longer benches have two armrests, creating three sections for people to sit in.

One of the improvement project's goals was increasing the amount of seating available on the Ped Mall, according to Iowa City Senior Civil Engineer Scott Sovers, who is overseeing the project.

"By and large, if you have a bench that doesn't have a center armrest, you find a lot of people aren't comfortable sitting on the bench when there's someone they don't know

already sitting on the bench," Sovers told Little Village.

The idea is that having an armrest in the middle creates separate spaces for people, and instead of ending up with one person per

> bench, two or three will sit comfortably—separately, but together.

Along with new benches, there will be table and seats sets, tiered seating at the Weather Dance Fountain and seat walls throughout the Ped Mall.

"We're offering roughly 213 seating options for folks," Sovers said, "whereas before, we were at roughly 178."

Improving accessibility for everyone is also an official goal of the project. On social media some people have suggested that extra armrests are required by the American with

Disabilities Act (ADA). They're not.

Section 903 of the ADA compliance guidelines covers benches, and while it discusses such topics as the height of a bench seat

(between 17 and 19 inches off the ground) and whether a bench should offer back support (yes), it doesn't mention armrests at all.

Although ADA guidelines don't cite bench armrests, they are mentioned in almost every article on "hostile architecture," the term for designs that discourage the homeless from using a public space.

"This year, #hostilearchitecture is trending, with photos of park benches with armrests down the middle that can render them impossible for sleeping, boulders planted into former homeless gathering places, and sprinklers engineered in public spaces for the presumed purpose of watering squatters, not greenery," Architectural Digest wrote in March.

Discouraging people from stretching out on Ped Mall benches wasn't a consideration when the new design was selected, Sovers said. And the issue never came up during the three public input sessions prior to the start of the project, all of which featured illustrations of the new benches, and all of which Little Village attended.

"By and large, the feedback we got was very positive on the benches we selected," Sovers said. "There was never a time where anybody brought up concerns about the ability to lay down on the benches."

Still, it's understandable why people might suspect Iowa City was trying to quietly push the homeless out of the Ped Mall. In 2013, the city council passed new ordinances prohibiting people from lying down on Ped Mall or other downtown benches between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., or to store personal possessions in any outdoor public space downtown (for example, by keeping them in a shopping cart).

Supporters of the ordinances insisted they weren't about the excluding the homeless, but just aimed at ending certain unwanted behavior. During the council meeting when the ordinances were approved, supporters did acknowledge the homeless were virtually the only ones who engaged in that unwanted behavior, but still insisted the new rules weren't targeting the homeless.

Sovers noted the bench replacement on the Ped Mall already happened elsewhere downtown two years ago. During the 2016 improvement project on Washington Street, new benches with center armrests were installed.

"As far as I know, no one has ever raised any objections about the design of those benches," he said. LV



# I.C. KINGS

e're just a bunch of weirdos performing with hair stuck to our faces in Iowa City. And that's really cool," says I.C. King Franky D. Lover. Beyond a touch of weirdness and fake facial hair, what does it take to be a king? Franky shared some tips.

### Find (and dress) your character

"Each performer in the group has their own drag character. Some have very out-there fantastic props, choreography, makeup or costumes; some go for humor, some go for sexy. I got a lot of inspiration from Madonna. She's one person but she has all these different looks and personas.

"If you're starting off and want to be a drag king, but don't often dress in a way that's masculine, you might go to the thrift store and get a pair of masculine pants or a suit jacket. It actually makes you feel different and that gets you moving differently."

### Pick your song

"What are you performing to? What song? Is it a mix of songs? There are times when you want a pop-y boy band song, or hit up the country music, or choose alternative rock stuff. I like to perform a variety, but

there are kings out there that have a niche."

### Plan your performance—sort of

"You have to have a plan, at least the broad strokes of it. The best thing is to come up with an idea, think it through, practice it. Then give it a shot. Don't plan it all out—there are times when you want some extra breathing room to take a tip or smile at someone. You want to care about what you're doing but you don't want to plan every second.

"Nerves happen for brand new people and performance veterans, too. Finding a way to calm your nerves or use that nervous energy in your performance is a big thing. Psych yourself up and go, 'You can do it, man!"" LV



ewton, Iowa native Spencer Loucks started doing stand-up comedy six years ago.

What's the first joke you ever told that made someone (other than yourself) laugh? I remember in kindergarten, I was reading from an ABCs book and was inserting swear words into them. Like, "A is for..." and then a bad word. Pretty lowbrow stuff, but also I was 6 at the time.

Which is your true love: writing or performing? I prefer writing but they both are quite fun. Performing in front of people gets you an immediate reaction, good or bad, so there's something to be said for that.

What's your favorite style of humor to perform? Self-deprecating humor is probably my favorite to perform. When you're making fun of yourself you never have to worry about making anyone else feel bad or wonder if you went too far.

How much does a sense of place play into what we find funny? Certain crowds/places definitely find different jokes funny or unfunny. Not only can it vary from city to city but just even different places around town. 

# BEST ELECTED OFFICIAL: STACEY **WALKER** AND **MAZAHIR SALIH**

Linn County Supervisor Stacey Walker and at-large Iowa City Council member Mazahir Salih ask each other a question.

Walker: I often feel as if I have two constituencies: One is comprised of people of color and the other is the rest of the people in my district. It's hard to explain to voters; people get really upset because they just don't understand the obligation to a group of people who have traditionally been underrepresented at every level of government. Do you find yourself in a similar position? If so, how do you help voters understand your obligations to communities of color?

Salih: Since I first ran, I said I represent all Iowa City regardless of if you're born in Iowa City or if you travelled the globe to get to Iowa City like me. That's why I ran: to represent the people who are underrepresented. They are the people I'd been working with. I feel what they feel, I feel their suffering. I've always said diversity on the council is really great so we can represent different communities, and I think voters respect that.

Salih: I've found it's easier to get constituents to vote for you than to get three fellow council members to vote the same way as you on something. Do you experience this in the Board of Supervisors?

Walker: I've been quite fortunate to have colleagues on the Board who are generally understanding of the policies and issues that I find important. My biggest battles have come from convincing other elected officials in municipal government to see the wisdom in supporting programs and initiatives that help the socially vulnerable ... As with all things, with time and an earnest commitment to progress, we will get better. LV

# **KURT FRIESE**

ove thy neighbor. Kurt Michael Friesewho died suddenly on Oct. 26, 2018, at the age of 54—lived these words, even if it wasn't the easiest path to take.

Johnson County Supervisors are rarely household names, but Friese's web of friends, community members and political supporters ensured that whether one agreed with his stances or not, he was well-known and respected.

The list of his contributions to the Johnson County community is quite long. Among the roles he played: chef, teacher, writer, activist, listener and—of course—neighbor. Friese was sworn in as a chair on the Johnson County Board of Supervisors on Jan. 3, 2017. He is perhaps best known as a chef and former co-owner of the downtown Iowa City restaurant Devotay. Friese was instrumental in bringing the slow food movement to Iowa

Friese graduated from Coe College in Cedar Rapids and later trained and taught at the New



England Food Institute. He served as editor and publisher of Edible Iowa River Valley, and authored multiple books, most recently A Cook's Journey: Slow Food in the Heartland. He contributed work to Little Village magazine from 2003 to 2008 and the political blog Bleeding Heartland from 2016 to 2018. Friese was a supporter of the Unitarian Universalist Society and Iowa City Pride, marching with the UUS in the 2018 Iowa City Pride parade.

In 2013, Kurt worked to train Shelter House residents in the Culinary Starts program, which aims to teach job skills to prepare its unemployed trainees for work in the food industry. Ever present, ever persistent, ever striving, Friese lived his vision of working for justice from the ground up: Sustainable food and agriculture leads to a healthy community, economy and environment. He poured love into his work.

In his obituary, author Elissa Altman quoted Friese's email to her after the 2016 election. "Love and understanding are the only weapons against fear," he wrote. Thank goodness people like Kurt Michael Friese show us how to use love as a weapon. This world needs more weapons like love. LV/

# NATALIA ESPINA

atalia Espina is the co-founder of the Eastern Iowa Community Bond Project. In a years-long process to gain her U.S. citizenship, Espina was briefly undocumented, which she said helped motivate her to become an activist and guerrero (warrior).

"[At the Eastern Iowa Community Bond Project] we provide a direct response, not necessarily a long-term answer, to the uptick in collateral arrests and immigration raids or sweeps under the Trump administration. Freedom from jail is related to an individual's ability to access \$1,500 and upward at the snap of their fingers. The immigration bond and detention system, and lack of oversight within it, is intended to unfairly punish poor people and people of color.

"Thus far, we've bonded out 34 individuals from across central and eastern Iowa, paying a total of \$159,500. The value of their freedom goes far beyond the average of \$5,000 per person gift.

"Recently, we heard back from the second participant who we helped bail out

in summer 2017. After being released on immigration bond, he was able to connect to legal representation. He now has a work permit, is gainfully employed, has his driver's license and purchased a vehicle. The likelihood is this individual will now be able to remain in the U.S. and will continue to work on regularizing his immigration status. In just over one year since his release from immigration jail, he has already made some massive strides. This is just one example of why we do the work we do. There is no price tag that can be placed on this tremendous success and positive outcome." LV/

After weeks of reaching out to grad students by mail, text and in person, COGS's campaign was successful: 1,559, or 80 percent, of graduate students voted to recertify COGS through at least 2020. # THE CZECH VILLAGE/ NEW BOHEMIA MAIN STREET DISTRICT

The Sinclair meatpacking plant opened on Cedar Rapids' South 3rd Street in 1872, attracting Czech immigrants with its ample job opportunities. Within a decade, churches and storefronts began popping up in the area, forming a "Little Bohemia."

The local Czech-Slovak Protective Society opened CSPS Hall on the corner of 1st Avenue and 3rd Street in June 1891, establishing a cultural center in the neighborhood.

In 1975, the Czech Heritage Foundation officially dubbed the 16th Avenue SW area of the neighborhood as "Czech Village." By 2000, the South End was called "New Bohemia," with locals focused on preserving its artistic and cultural heritage.

In 1991, the nonprofit Legion Arts settled into the historic CSPS Hall.

On Oct. 21, 1995, Bill Clinton joined fellow presidents Václav Havel of the Czech Republic and Michal Kováč of the Slovak Republic in Cedar Rapids to dedicate the National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library (NCSML).

The flood of **2008** devastated the neighborhood, including nearly all businesses and residences. Many never recovered, but those that did, along with nonprofit organizations and new developers, began to rebuild (and rebrand) the area.

The Czech Village/New Bohemia Main Street District was formed in May 2009 with a mission to "breathe economic life into a historic area of Cedar Rapids," according to the district's website.

Today, the district offers robust shopping, dining, art and tourist attractions. The area is home to NewBo City Market, the fully refurbished CSPS Hall, NCSML, the African American Museum of Iowa and much more. LV/

**Amazing Space:** The solar panels in Indian Creek's Amazing Space helped the center achieve a Net Zero Energy certification from 2017-18, meaning the renewable sources served all the center's energy needs and then some (like, 94 tons of coal worth of excess energy).

Water treatment: Their Wetland Wastewater Treatment System uses no chemicals or energy. Wastewater from sinks and toilets travel from a septic tank to two cells where plant roots (including cattails and wildflowers) help clean the water underground. Bonus: These cells are lovely to look at and serve as animal habitats.

Rain garden: The center works to keep run-off out of Indian Creek by trading asphalt and concrete for permeable, surprisingly sturdy grassy paving. A permeable chipped limestone is used for paths. Rainwater is collected in both the center's rain garden full of native plants and its 65-gallon rainwater collection device, nicknamed "Moby," which recycles the water for gardening. LV/

**Lighting:** CRPL "harvests daylight" with plenty of energy-efficient, strategically located windows utilizing the light from the sun while avoiding glare on the library's tables and computers. Automated shades can sense the intensity of the light, and overhead lighting fixtures automatically dim or turn off when the sun is doing the lighting for them.

**HVAC system:** The CRPL employs a geothermal heat exchange, consuming around a third of the energy the old library building used. LV/

nne Marsh has worked as an artist at Iowa City Tattoo (formerly Nemesis) in downtown Iowa City since 2009.

How did you decide to become a tattoo artist? When I was a kid I was perpetually drawing, painting, working with clay or plaster or fabric, or anything I could get my hands on. It was kind of a weird path to becoming a tattooer, but ultimately I fell in love with the craft ... It has probably been the steepest learning curve I've encountered, both creatively and professionally.

What are your favorite tattoos to design and execute? My affinity for the traditional American tattoo style was a little bit of a surprise since it was so different from my usual artistic approach. At this point I really like anything to do with flora or fauna and particularly bringing in motifs found in traditional folk arts. I have been super happy that I've gotten asked to do a few portraits—either people or pets!

#### How are you able to relate to clients and make their vision a reality?

It's important to me that I work in such a way that I make sure people know they are safe and will have their voices heard. It's also pretty vital to be an active part of the community and to use the space we have to give back as much as possible, as with our Emma Goldman fundraiser.

I think women and LGBT+ folks are definitely using tattoos as tools of empowerment. Tattoos can be a badge or a signifier, as well as a powerful way to practice body autonomy. I think it means even more to feel comfortable exerting that power in a space that has been traditionally cishet male dominated. LV/

here is an adage that says that rock music in particular benefits when conservatives are running the country. The idea is that musicians tend to hold more liberal stances, and when those ideologies are challenged, the response is in the music. But while the intersection of music and politics is certainly not new, by and large, it has been somewhat rare in popular music recently.

Quad Cities band Chrash followed 2016's *Things My Friends Say* with a surprise release coinciding with the Nov. 6 primaries. Titled 2017 The Music, the album attempts to capture the year following the 2016 elections. Chris Bernat, the lead singer and songwriter for Chrash, noticed that the new songs he was writing were drawn from the headlines and conversations he was having around the new political landscape.

In an email exchange, Bernat explains, "As a songwriter influenced in my formative years by bands that would speak and write about issues of the day, I thought the time might be right to dive into concept territory ... Fueled by the frustration felt as the 'elected' seemed to be sabotaging democracy, the music and lyrics came easier than material had in the past."

The album opens with "Flowers of the Feel," a song that Bernat said they started with to represent the songs the band recorded before the 2016 elections—in his words, "abstract and nebulous." It's a great song—I love the clean jazzy chords that open it and reoccur throughout; the buzzy guitar solo around 1:45 is a nice contrast.

It only takes a look at the other song titles

to see where the album stands politically. "Demon in a White House" doesn't name any names—it doesn't have to. "Tweet Storm" is a tongue-in-cheek title for a swinging barebones instrumental interlude anchored in bass and drums that wraps up in a minute.

The lack of a lot of politically topical albums like 2017 The Music may be due to the

name of the holiday gracing the title of the disc and included in seven of the song titles (if you count Christmas Eve and Xmas), is a Christmas album only inasmuch as it collects songs written about the day. It's not cloying or common or overly familiar. There's only the briefest of nods to the traditional, and the songs that sound the most Christmas-y

are the ones with tongue planted firmly in cheek ("A Very Funky Christmas" could easily stand strong in the company of "Grandma Got Run Over by a Reindeer").

None of these songs will have you competing with your friends to see who can go the longest

without hearing them each year. (I'm sure Mariah Carey "regrets" "All I Want for Christmas is You" all the way to the bank—but some part of her has to cringe at the start of the holiday season just like the rest of us.) Rather, they are plain good playing and writing that almost feel like they touch on Christmas by accident, through honest storytelling. Album opener "It Almost Feels Like Christmas," in its aching (but not maudlin) melancholy ranks with Joni Mitchell's "River" and Casiotone for the Painfully Alone's "Cold, White Christmas" for laying bare the holiday reactions we're not supposed to talk about.

Henderson is a long-time Iowa City staple who's name comes up with the likes of Dave Moore and Catfish Keith. He's been playing for years, and his skill is on full display on this record. It's a Christmas album for folks who dig traditional Iowa folk and blues, especially in its songwriting and philosophy.

"Start spreading the news/that those Muslims and Jews/can come to the party this year," Henderson sings in "Let's Put the X Back in Xmas," a tune with a tinge of honkeytonk that also namechecks "weird Unitarians," "all you heathens," and more. "Little Jesus was only a baby/And maybe he was who he was/But if you're keeping score/we never started a war/in the name of old Santa Claus./I can't find one goddamned good reason/to spoil this season of holiday cheer/So let's put the X back in Xmas/and celebrate each day of the year."

Forget December. For this record, I'm in each day of the year. LV
