THE FEINBERG AWARD

WWQR is pleased to announce that Walter Grünzweig of Karl-Franzens-Universität in Graz, Austria, is the winner of this year's Feinberg Award. Grünzweig's essay, "'Collaborators in the Great Cause of Liberty and Fellowship': Whitmania as an Intercultural Phenomenon," appeared in Volume 5, Number 4 (Spring 1988). The Feinberg Award is given annually to the author of the best essay published in WWQR during the preceding year. The selection is made by the Editors and the Editorial Board and carries an honorarium of \$200. The award honors the memory of the distinguished Whitman bibliophile, Charles E. Feinberg (1899–1988), whose work initiated and energized much of the Whitman scholarship of this century.
